Our Board consists of 25 volunteers who meet once a month.





- 3,414 Orange County residents were provided with emergency food, rent, and utility assistance
- Over 25,000 meals were delivered to 250 disabled or elderly residents
- 235 women with their children were provide refuge and shelter from domestic violence
- 205 Orange County residents received treatment for drug, alcohol, and other substance abuse
- 228 individuals received mental health counseling
- 307 children completed character development, leadership, and ethics programs
- 54 displaced children were provided a CASA advocate to help them through the judicial process

Our 2024 Day of Caring
