Our Board consists of 25 volunteers who meet once a month.



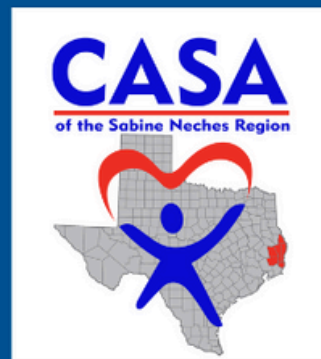

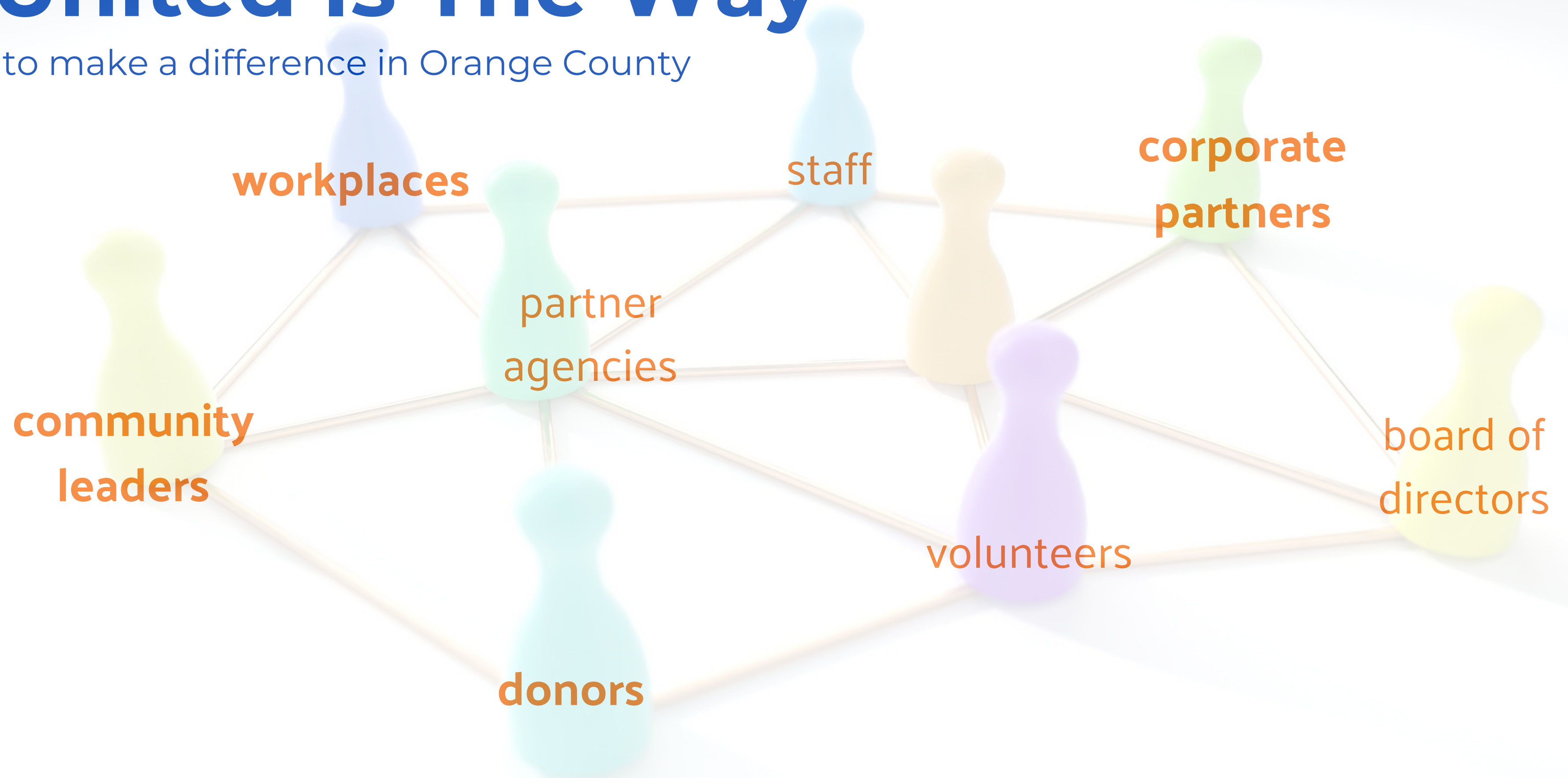

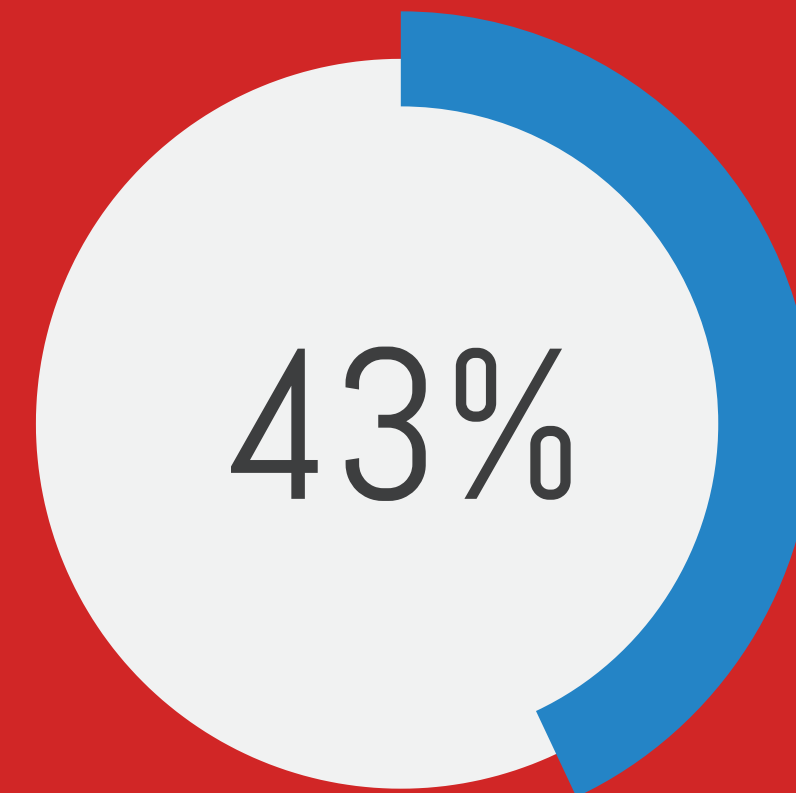
ALICE represents the growing number of families who are unable to afford the basics of housing, child care, food, transportation, health care and technology.

These workers often struggle to keep their own households from financial ruin, while keeping our local communities running.

Impact that inspires

- 3,414 Orange County residents were provided with emergency food, rent, and utility assistance
- Over 25,000 meals were delivered to 250 disabled or elderly residents
- 235 women with their children were provide refuge and shelter from domestic violence
- 205 Orange County residents received treatment for drug, alcohol, and other substance abuse
- 228 individuals received mental health counseling
- 307 children completed character development, leadership, and ethics programs
- 54 displaced children were provided a CASA advocate to help them through the judicial process

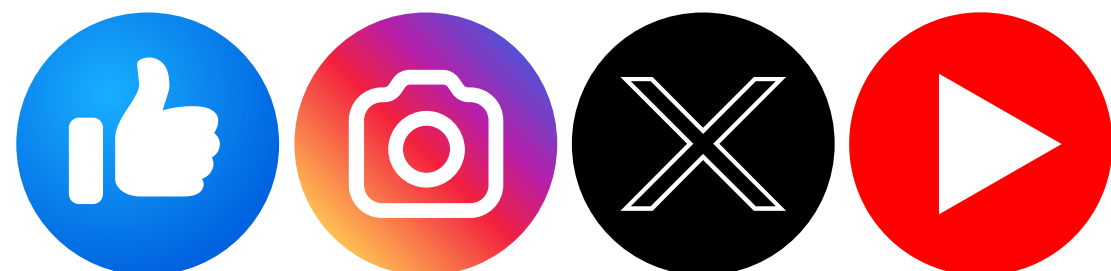

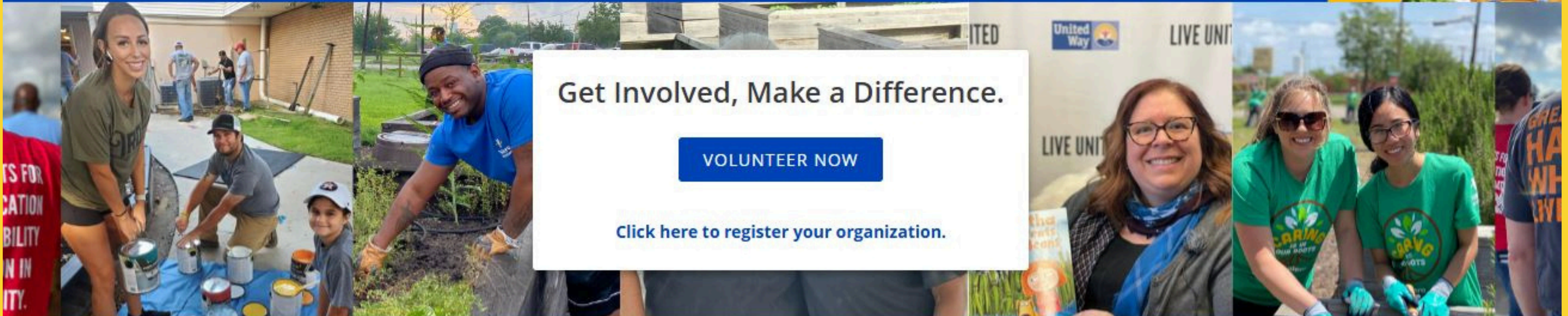
