Things to know and share with your team...

- Groups of volunteers will be working on special projects by Partner Agencies for United Way of Orange County and/or flood-impacted homes as a result of Harvey or Imelda. Work will include but not be limited to painting, construction, and cleanup.
- Dress appropriately. Check the weather for the forecasted temperatures. Wear your United Way Day of Caring shirt. Jeans or shorts are fine. Keep in mind that they may get dirt, paint, or stain on them; you may also be bending, stooping, or climbing on a ladder.
- Wear closed toe shoes. Open toe shoes will NOT be permitted at the worksites. Sneakers/tennis shoes are acceptable.
- If the hardhats are required, other caps, hats, or head coverings are not allowed to be worn under the hardhat.
- Volunteers should bring their own PPE (personal protective equipment) such as safety glasses, gloves, etc.
- Volunteers can bring their own small hand tools and tool belts if desired.
- Individuals with long hair should have their hair put back or put up as to reduce the risk of getting caught in rotating tools, etc.
- If you so desire, bring sunscreen and/or insect repellent.
- Bottled water will be available at the worksites.

- 7:45 a.m. - arrive at the Orange County Convention and Expo Center (11475 FM 1442, Orange, Texas 77630)
- Kickoff/Welcome; All volunteers MUST be here for the safety orientation
- Depart for assigned worksites
- Lunch (at worksite)
- Continue at worksite
